Introduction

The Get Plugins plugin for WordPress is extremely simple to use, but is a HUGE time saver.

It allows you to create a list of all your favourite plugins that can then be installed all in one go in just a few seconds.

No more waiting for FTP to upload every individual file.

No more having to use the browser uploader to install each plugin.

Just upload Get Plugins, optionally paste your own list of plugin zip URLs into the box, and click the "Submit" button. After a few seconds, all your standard plugins will have downloaded and installed themselves.

Then all you need do is activate each one as you need it and depending on what kind of blog you're creating.

Installing

Simply upload the plugin zip using the WP admin panel browser uploader and activate.

Alternatively:-

- #1 - Unzip and save the extracted folder somewhere you can find it.
- #2 - Use your FTP client (FileZilla?) to upload the folder to your /wp-content/plugins/ directory on your WordPress blog.
- #3 - Login to your WordPress admin page and activate.

Upgrading

- #1 - First BACK UP YOUR WORDPRESS DATABASE! We won't take any responsibility for your data, you have to look after it yourself.
- #2 - Deactivate the existing version of the plugin.
- #3 - Use your FTP client to delete the existing plugin.
- #4 - Unzip the new version and save the extracted folder somewhere you can find it.
- #5 - Use your FTP client to upload the newly extracted folder to your /wp-content/plugins/ directory on your WordPress blog.
- #6 - Reactivate the plugin.

Trouble Shooting

If your blog complains with a "headers already sent" error message when you activate the plugin or otherwise adversely affects your blog, then the first thing you should do is delete the plugin with your FTP client, and your blog will be restored to normal.

Next report the issue to support using the URL below, and if possible give your WP admin login details and also your FTP login details.

Usage

Included File List

Inside the plugin zip is a file called pg-get-plugins.txt. This text file contains a list (one per line) of the location of each plugin zip you want to install.

You can modify this file in a plain text editor like Notepad to include the locations of any other plugins you use as standard, and you can also remove any of the suggestions we've made if you don't like them. Once you've edited the file, just add it back into the zip.

Adding Plugins To The List After Activation

If you wish, you can empty the pg-get-plugins.txt and then add your list of plugins URLs by copying and pasting. You can alternatively upload a list of plugins using the included browser uploader.

Once you've added the zip locations using whichever method suits your style of working, all you need then do is click the "Submit" button.

Each plugin downloads and installs in its own thread and is independent of the other plugins. Wait a few seconds and you will begin to see each plugin download and install itself.

Each plugin installs independently of the others. You can see the current status of each plugin as it installs.

As a very rough guideline, depending on the number of plugins and how busy each site is, it will take around 30 seconds or so to install all the example plugins we've supplied in the text file.

Once they've all completed, then all you need do is go activate the plugins you wish to use depending on the kind of blog you're building, as you normally would.

That's all there is to it!
